Elena Lesley recently returned to the U.S. after spending a year and a half in Cambodia writing about the Khmer Rouge tribunal on a Fulbright Fellowship. Her project included monitoring the court, blogging regularly about proceedings at www.elena.phnompenhpost.com and contributing pieces to Cambodian and international publications. She also assisted a local Cambodian radio station with its coverage of the tribunal.

Before beginning her Fulbright, Lesley worked as a reporter at the *St. Petersburg Times* newspaper in Florida, covering mostly political and legal issues. A fellowship from the Henry Luce Foundation initially took her to Cambodia in 2004-2005.

Lesley's work has appeared in a number of print and online publications, including *Granta.com* and *The Huffington Post*. She graduated from Brown University in 2004 with a degree in Political Science.
